Randy'L is active in the tribal and regional community and sits on various committees and boards including: former Board member of Blackfoot Chamber of Commerce Board (3 year term), Pocatello Rotary, Southeast Idaho High Country tourism board member, member of Pocatello Chamber of Commerce, Idaho State Historical Society Tribal representative, member of the State of Idaho Indian Education Board and Museum of Idaho Board member.

Randy'L Teton was born and raised Blackfoot, Idaho in Lincoln Creek district on the Fort Hall Reservation. Ms. Teton graduated from Blackfoot high school and attended the following colleges: Institute of American Indian Arts (IAIA) in Santa Fe, New Mexico graduated with an Associates of Fine Arts in Museum Studies; Fort Lewis College in Durango, Colorado; University of New Mexico in Albuquerque, New Mexico graduated with a Bachelor of Fine Arts in Art History and minor in Native American Studies.
