The Lillian Vallely School is located 200 feet north of the Fort Hall Indian Reservation. It was founded in 1998 by Lillian Vallely, a tribal elder, and a Bishop of the Episcopal Church. Lillian saw a need to secure the future of children in the Shoshone-Bannock tribes from drugs, alcohol, violence, and teen pregnancy which were tearing families apart.

The vision was for a school where young children would be equipped with the tools necessary to be academically excellent, where Native Culture would be honored and preserved, and where basic Christian values would be taught and demonstrated.

Our Mission

The Lillian Vallely School exists to help Native American children, K – 5, build a bridge to their future success educationally, socially, and spiritually through a quality education consisting of academics, Shoshone-Bannock cultural heritage, and basic Christian values. The measure of success is to expand a student's ability to navigate Native and non-Native cultures, to compete academically, and to become a constructive influence at home and in the community.

Why Invest in LVS Now?

LVS is unique! It is a 501c3 with a 20-years track record. The student/teacher ratio is 14:1. Teacher aides also provide additional reinforcement. Our strong cultural ties and early intervention are powerful reasons LVS can create more meaningful experiences in a child's school career.

LVS families are benefited by the personal interaction they have with faculty and staff, the impact of which is much larger and more positive than the enrollment might suggest.

The Southeastern Idaho community benefits because LVS creates a stronger and more integrated cultural experience for its students. By building on each year's continual successes, those experiences ultimately lead to a more positive and cooperative tribal influence in the community.

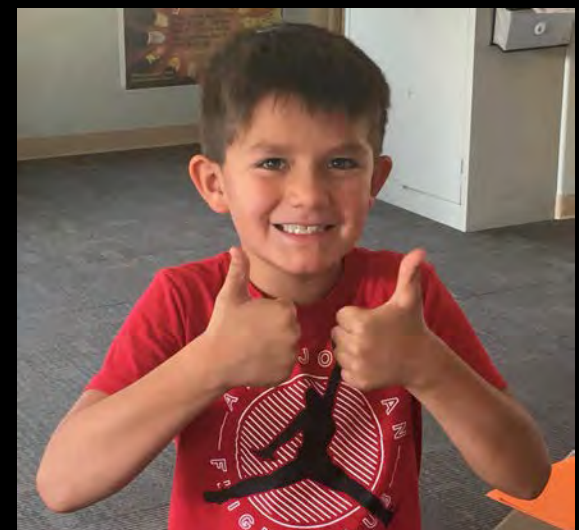

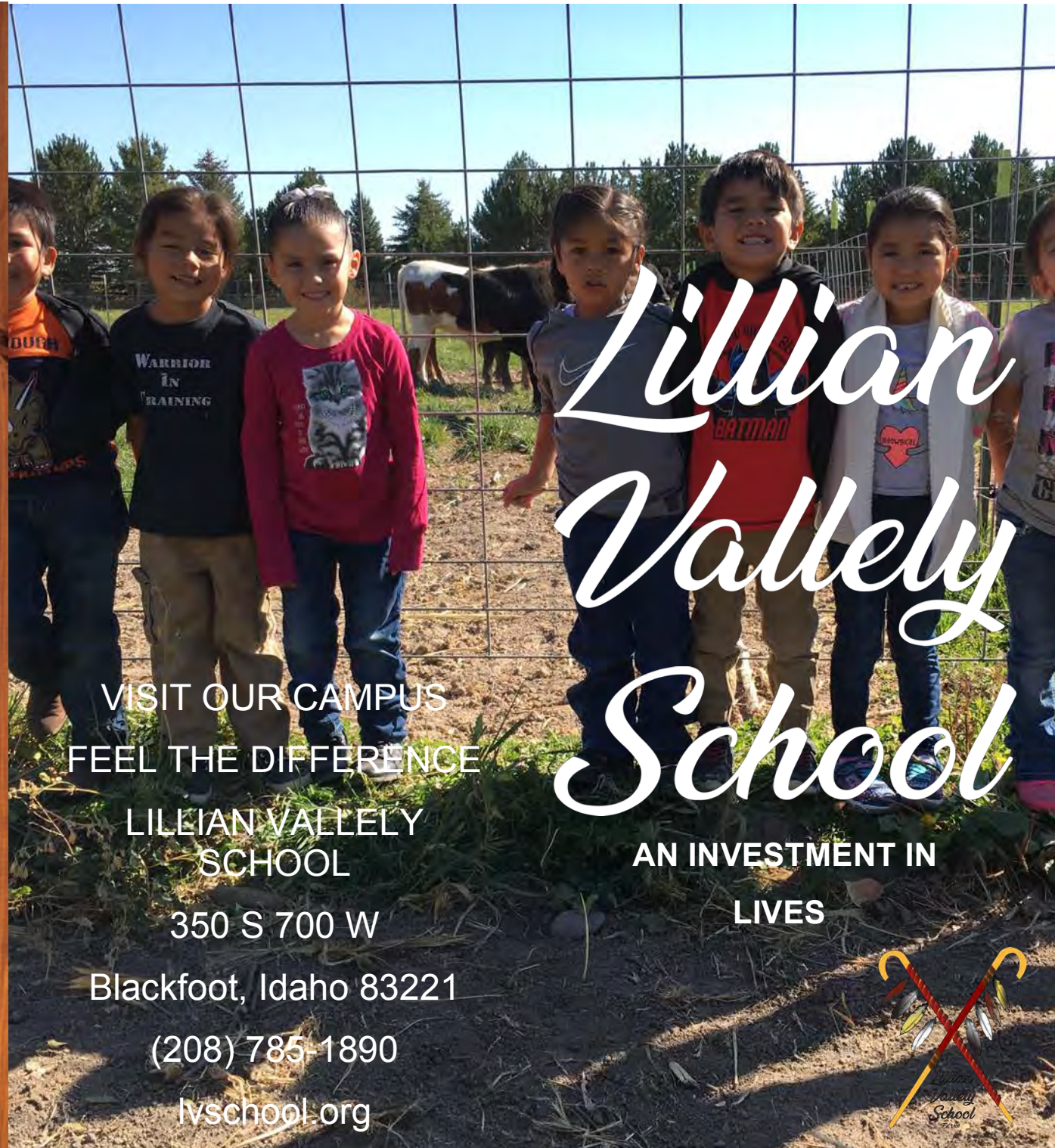
